## Hello Innocademy Families!

March is reading month! We would like to encourage all of our Inno families to see all the places reading can take you as you make time to read together as a family. Did you know that children who are read to have a greater capacity to process more of what they hear and at faster speeds?

Dr. John S. Hutton, Cincinnati Children's Hospital said, "There is a greater experience with language and imagination during story time and children will enjoy a cognitive advantage over peers who have not been read to." When watching a video, higher-order brain networks are not stimulated. The brain has to do a bit of work when it is read to: it makes the experience engaging and fun while reinforcing the brain connections that enable young children to process harder and more complex stories as they get older.

Reading aloud has a multitude of benefits including:

- Improving listening comprehension and vocabulary
- Providing fluency models
- Promoting conceptual understanding
- Lengthening attention spans
- Creating a positive attitude toward books and reading

Reading together as a family strengthens the emotional bonds between the adult reader and the child, providing those positive parent-child connections essential to a child's psychological health and academic growth

Here's how to get started: Start small and start where you are. First, put down all technology including silencing your phones. Pick up a book, magazine or cereal box and try reading out loud to someone you love. Try this for 10 minutes a day and build from there. Enjoy yourself! Try silly voices or comic accents or singing! If your child is already a reader, take turns. If you have a trip planned or even if your morning commute is the only time you have quiet time together, check out a recorded book to listen to. The benefits are the same either way!

Here is a short list of books to help you discover quality books to share together:

The Enchanted Hour by Meghan Cox Gurdon The Read Aloud Handbook by Jim Trelease Honey for a Child's Heart by Gladys Hunt The Ramped Up Read Aloud by Maria Walther Read All About It! By Jim Trelease

We can't wait to see the places reading will take us. Keep track of the number of pages you read together for the month of March. We will convert every page to a mile and see where those miles could take us!
